Matatiele strengthens communication approach.

In its attempt to strengthen communication approach, Matatiele Local Municipality reviewed its Communication Action Plan, in a workshop recently held were Public Service Commission Chairperson, Prof. Somadoda Fikeni was a special guest wherein in his contribution he delivered an input under the theme “Strengthening public trust through ethical, citizen-cantered government communication.” Prof. Fikeni further emphasised that government must prioritise its people and serve them with dignity not forgetting segmentation and priorities in its communication approach. “We are not favoured because we are the best or because we are geniuses. We must not squander any opportunity to serve, Fikeni concluded.”

The review session brought together key municipal

stakeholders including Ward Councillors, Ward Committees, Community Development Workers and frontline officials to reflect on current communication initiatives, assess progress, identify gaps, and strengthen strategies that keep residents informed and involved. Discussions covered critical touchpoints for resident’s turnaround times for service delivery queries, effectiveness of ward-based communication systems, use of digital platforms like WhatsApp groups and the municipal website, and accessibility of information for elderly and rural communities. In his address the Mayor, Patrick Stuurman said, effective communication is the bridge between the municipality and the people we serve. The session focused on sharpening how we share information ensuring every voice in

Matatiele is heard, from ward meetings to water outage notices and infrastructure project updates. Recommendations from the workshop will be consolidated into a revised Communication

Action Plan to be tabled before Council for approval. The communication plan aims to improve responsiveness, language accessibility, and two-way engagement across all 27 wards of Matatiele.



Customer Care Day Reinforces Partnership Between Municipality and Community

As part of its commitment to accountability, transparency, and improved service delivery, Matatiele Local Municipality hosted a Customer Care Day with residents and stakeholders. The engagement provided an important platform for open dialogue, allowing community members to raise concerns, share suggestions, and gain a better understanding of municipal services and programmes.

The objective of the Customer Care Day was to strengthen the relationship between the Municipality and the communities it serves by promoting mutual

understanding, improving communication, and reinforcing the Municipality's commitment to responsive and people-centred service delivery. The discussions focused on the challenges and opportunities surrounding service delivery, with emphasis on working together to find sustainable solutions that will improve the quality of life for all residents. In his remarks, Mayor Patrick Stuurman encouraged residents to play an active role in protecting and developing the town. "Let us respect each other and take care of our town in order to continue with a beautiful destination of Matatiele said Stuurman."

Services on Wheels Brings Government Services Closer to Ward 11 Residents



Multi-sectoral services on wheels outreach programme continues to reach communities across Matatiele in an effort to bring services closer to where people live.

The outreach programme was recently held at Mapfontein village, Ward 11. This programme formed part of a series of programmes conducted as part of the Human Right Month activities, wherein various government departments and private partners collaborated to

provide essential services, information, and support to residents. The theme for this year's Human Right Month is "Bill of Rights at 30: Making Human Dignity Real." The initiative forms part of the municipality's commitment to ensuring that all citizens, particularly those in remote areas like Mapfontein, have access to government services, information and development opportunities. During the engagement, Department of Education emphasised the critical role

parents play in their children's educational success. The department encouraged parents to actively participate in school activities and monitor their children's academic progress.

Among issue raised by the department was a concern regarding the implementation of the school nutrition programme, highlighting the importance of providing quality and nutritious meals to learners, it also indicated that food handlers should be rotated periodically to ensure that employment opportunities and benefits are shared fairly within communities.

In implementing school nutrition, the department encouraged residents to engage in agricultural production, noting that local farmers and producers can play a significant role in supplying food to schools and strengthening the local economy.

The Department of Agriculture used the platform to raise awareness about the outbreak of Foot and Mouth Disease, urging livestock owners to remain vigilant and adhere to

set precautionary measures. Officials explained that the disease affects cattle, pigs, and horses and, while there is currently no cure, it can be effectively managed through vaccination and proper livestock management practices. The department also reaffirmed its commitment to supporting local farmers through livestock improvement programmes. Meanwhile, the South African Police Service (SAPS) brought a mobile service truck to the outreach programme, enabling community members to access policing services closer to where they live. The mobile truck provided assistance with case-related enquiries and guidance on compliance requirements for liquor trading. The Services on Wheels programme continues to demonstrate the value of integrated government service delivery by bringing departments together to address community needs, promote development, and ensure that citizens enjoy their constitutional right to access basic services.

As part of commemorating Child Protection Week, Matatiele Local Municipality and Alfred Nzo District

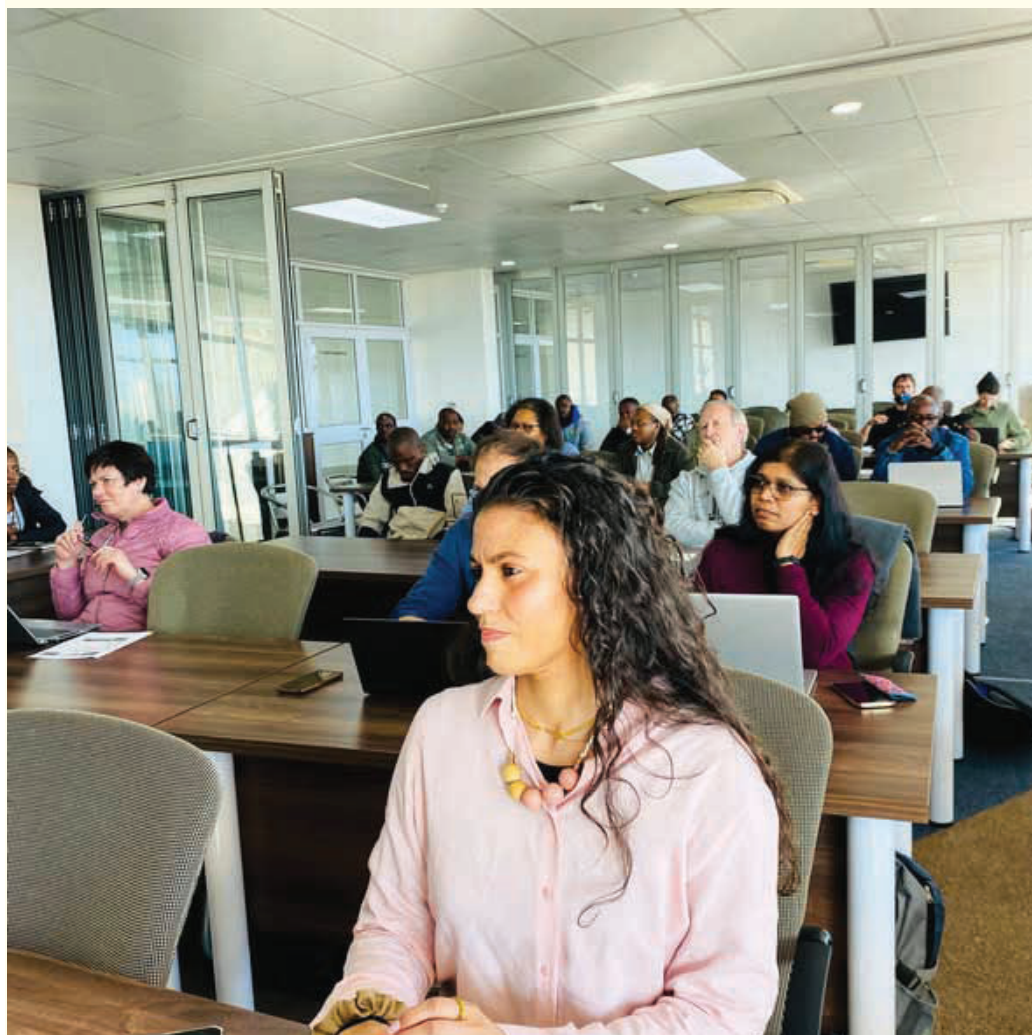
Municipality conducted a joint effort by handing over sanitary dignity packs at Popopo Senior Secondary School in Ward 15. Sanitary packs were distributed

Stakeholders Gather in Matatiele for the 48th Umzimvubu Catchment Partnership Meeting



Amidst environmental challenges that confronts Matatiele and its neighbouring municipalities, the uMzimvubu Catchment Partnership hosted its 48th

meeting in Matatiele, wherein multi-stakeholders, ranging from Alfred Nzo District Local Municipalities, Government departments, entities and environmental organisations, converged under one roof

to develop and share best practices and strategies to address threats to biodiversity.

Addressing the session, Mayor Patrick Stuurman emphasised to the stakeholders that the engagement takes place during the Africa Month which is critical period in mobilising stakeholders across the board towards finding indigenous methods of preventing environmental degradation which threatens livelihoods and developmental aspirations of the region and the continent. He reminded everyone of our collective responsibility to protect natural resources, biodiversity, wetlands, and water systems for future generations.

Mayor Stuurman further highlighted the recent Earth Day programme which was held at Wilfred Bauer Nature Reserve, where schools,

environmental stakeholders, and community partners came together to promote environmental education and conservation. The Earth Day theme for 2026 is "Our Power, Our Planet" which resonates with the collective efforts which drive the multi-sectoral approach that uMzimvubu Catchment Partnership implements. Appreciating the inter-generational approach, wherein pupils were at the centre of environmental awareness campaign held as part of the Earth Day in order for them to be informed of the environmental responsibility that they hold as a future generation. This engagement further emphasised the importance of keeping the environment clean through recycling initiatives, including the collection of recyclable waste and cans to help maintain cleanliness within our towns and communities.

Working Together to End GBVF and Protect the Vulnerable

In an effort to address growing numbers of Gender-Based Violence and Femicide (GBVF) cases in Ward 25, targeted at women, children and vulnerable groups, a multi-sectoral stakeholders converged under one roof to mobilise community and stakeholders to fight the scourge. The engagement also touched on mental health challenges that impacts victim and community at large, amidst growing GBVF cases in Ward 25 and across other areas in Matatiele.

The multi-sectoral intervention held at Khauoe village was led by ILIMA Rural Development Foundation which partnered with Matatiele Local Municipality, Yomelela Community Development Organisation,

Thusong White Door Centre, South African Police Service (SAPS), Koinonia NPO, the Department of Social Development, Masakiea Nkopane Foundation and community leaders. The session brought together various stakeholders and community members in an effort to educate and empower the community on GBVF which is affecting vulnerable groups. Representatives from the participating stakeholders shared valuable information on the prevention of abuse, mental health awareness, support services available to victims and the importance of reporting abuse cases. Community members also had an opportunity to openly share their experiences and concerns, creating a platform for healing and support. Speaking during the programme, Ward 25 Councillor

Maile Mapena emphasised the importance of collective responsibility in fighting Gender Based Violence and Femicide in our communities. "As leaders and community members, we must work together to fight against gender-based violence, child and elderly abuse, and break the silence surrounding mental health. Together, we can build safer and healthier communities for everyone," said Cllr. Mapena. The programme highlighted the importance of collaboration between government departments, community organisations, law enforcement agencies, and residents in addressing social challenges and protecting the rights and dignity of vulnerable groups. The session concluded with a call for continued awareness



campaigns, community support and active involvement in creating a society free from violence and abuse.

Improved Road Access Brings Hope for Motseng Residents

Residents of Motseng Village in Ward 14 are set to benefit from improved access to essential services following the official handover of a road rehabilitation project aimed at enhancing mobility and connectivity within the community.

Mayor Cllr. Patrick Stuurman, accompanied by Members of the Executive Committee and Ward 14 Councillor Mojabeng Molefe, officially handed over the contractor for the rehabilitation of the Motseng access road during a community engagement attended by residents, municipal officials, and other stakeholders. The project entails the re-gravelling of 4.6 kilometres of an existing access road, which is expected to benefit 98 households and approximately 590 residents. Once completed, the road will improve access to schools, healthcare facilities, police services,

and other key public amenities. Addressing community members, Mayor Stuurman highlighted the significance of the project in improving the lives of residents. "This road is more than gravel and concrete; it is a pathway to opportunity. It will improve access to schools, clinics, and essential services while investing in the dignity and future of every household in Motseng," said Mayor Stuurman. The Mayor also called on residents to protect the infrastructure and support the successful implementation of the project for the benefit of current and future generations. The scope of work includes the re-gravelling of a 4.6 km long and 5-metre-wide access road, installation of stormwater drainage infrastructure, and the construction of a reinforced concrete slab. The project is expected to be completed within eight months. Given the area's steep terrain and wet

climatic conditions, special attention has been given to stormwater management and drainage infrastructure to protect the road and ensure its long-term sustainability. The project forms part of ongoing

efforts to improve rural infrastructure, enhance accessibility, and create safer and more reliable transport routes for communities across the municipality.



Council Adopts 2026/27 Budget Following Extensive Community Consultation



Residents across Matatiele are set to benefit from a development-focused 2026/27 Budget that has since been formally adopted by Council following an extensive public participation process that included community outreach engagements across various wards.

The adoption of the budget on 28 May 2026 follows a three-day

Draft Budget Community Outreach Programme, conducted in line with Section 23(1) of the Municipal Finance Management Act, which provided residents with an opportunity to engage, make inputs, and influence key development priorities for the new financial year. The process was preceded by the tabling of the 2026/27 Financial Year Budget by Mayor Cllr. Patrick Stuurman during a Special Council

Sitting held at the Maggie Tsiu-Resha Building. This marked the beginning of an inclusive consultation process aimed at strengthening transparency, accountability, and community participation in municipal planning. Seven outreach teams were deployed across different wards, engaging communities on proposed allocations, service delivery priorities, and planned development initiatives. The engagements also provided a platform for residents to share input on infrastructure development, economic opportunities, and service delivery improvements. The adopted budget reflects a total revenue of R694.9 million for the 2026/27 financial year, with operating expenditure projected at R645.7 million and capital expenditure set at R157 million. A strong emphasis has been placed on infrastructure development and service delivery. Infrastructure Planning and Development received the largest allocation of R128.4 million for roads, electrification, and infrastructure projects. Community Services has been allocated R7.3 million, while Economic Development and Planning received R7.8

million to support Local Economic Development and planning initiatives. Further allocations include R7 million for Corporate Services, R3.2 million for Budget and Treasury, and R3 million for the Office of the Municipal Manager, ensuring continued institutional support and effective governance. Speaking during the budget tabling, Mayor Stuurman emphasised that the budget is designed to respond to community needs through improved infrastructure, sustainable service delivery, and investment in programmes that promote economic growth and development. The Municipality further noted that the outreach process and engagements played a critical role in shaping the final budget, ensuring that community priorities were taken into account in the planning process. The 2026/27 Budget will guide municipal spending and development priorities over the coming financial year, with a continued focus on improving service delivery, expanding infrastructure investment, and supporting inclusive local economic growth across all communities.

Residents Join Hands in "Bin-It" Campaign to Promote Cleaner Matatiele

Cleaning campaign efforts in Matatiele town brought together residents, government stakeholders, and correctional services participants in a shared drive to promote cleanliness, responsibility, and environmental awareness. The "Bin-It" campaign, implemented as a collaborative initiative, focuses not only on cleaning public spaces but also on encouraging behavioural change and accountability in waste management.

As part of the latest activation, the Matatiele Local Municipality partnered with the Department of Environment, Fisheries and Forestry, alongside nine parolees from the Department of Correctional Services to clean key streets within the town. The initiative is aimed at

encouraging residents and visitors to take responsibility for maintaining a clean environment by disposing of waste correctly, even in everyday actions such as using bins for small litter items. It further promotes the broader goal of achieving a waste-free town through sustained awareness and community participation. Community Services Portfolio Head, Ward 19 Councillor Sheree Booth, said the programme responds directly to concerns raised by residents regarding cleanliness in the town. "This initiative goes beyond picking up litter. It is about fostering a culture of responsibility, self-awareness, and making the conscious decision to use bins instead of littering," said Cllr. Booth. The participation of parolees formed part of a rehabilitation

and reintegration programme implemented by the Department of Correctional Services, aimed at supporting their reintegration into society through community service.

The Municipality continues to encourage residents, businesses, and stakeholders to work together in keeping Matatiele clean, safe, and environmentally responsible.



Learners at Sijoka Primary Receive School Shoes Through Community Partnership

A sense of excitement and gratitude filled Sijoka Primary School as learners received school shoes through a partnership between Matatiele Local Municipality and Nedbank, aimed at supporting education and restoring confidence among young learners. The donation of 30 pairs of school shoes formed part of a collaborative effort to ensure that learners attend school with dignity and confidence, reducing barriers that may affect school attendance and participation. Speaking during the handover, Mayor Cllr. Patrick Stuurman highlighted the importance of education and the role of collective

support in building a positive learning environment for children. "We are here to encourage our learners to attend school every day with confidence," said Mayor Stuurman. The initiative reflects ongoing efforts by the Municipality to support local schools and promote education, while also strengthening partnerships with the private sector. Nedbank's contribution was welcomed as an example of meaningful corporate social responsibility, demonstrating how collaboration between government and business can make a positive difference in the lives of young learners and communities.



Mayoral Cup Uncovers Rising Football Talent

The 2025 Mayoral Cup has once again proven to be a vital platform for uncovering and nurturing promising young football talent within Matatiele.

The tournament continues to serve as a strategic talent identification initiative, creating opportunities for young players to showcase their abilities and progress within structured football development pathways. A total of 26 players were selected through the tournament and have since been actively participating in structured training sessions and coaching clinics as part of their ongoing development programme. These initiatives are aimed at strengthening technical ability, tactical understanding, and overall player development, while opening pathways toward participation in higher levels of competitive football. development drive, four additional players were selected following a trial match between the Matatiele Mayoral Squad and the Chippa United squad at Ku-Gompo. The fixture provided a high-level exposure opportunity for local players to test their skills against a professional setup and demonstrate their readiness for advancement. This continued investment in youth development reflects the commitment to nurturing local sporting talent, expanding opportunities for young athletes, and building sustainable pathways for growth within football.
